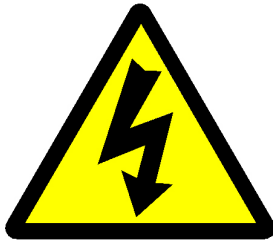

Please consider any of these programs to being more energy efficient. One at a time, we can make a difference.

High efficiency heat pumps incentive

Cedar-Knox PPD is partnering with Nebraska PPD and is now offering incentive payments for high-efficiency heat pumps for residential customers as of September 1, 2008. Your local HVAC dealer has been made aware of this program also. If you are thinking of installing a heat pump or have done so, since September 1st, please talk to your dealer or contact us with your questions about this program.

Minimum requirements stipulate that to be approved, the heat pump must be Energy Star qualified. While the seasonal energy efficiency rating (SEER) must be 14 SEER or greater and determines the level of rebate, all qualifying heat pumps must also have an 8.2 heating seasonal efficiency factor (HSPF).

HEAT PUMP	REBATE
14 SEER	\$200
15 SEER	\$250
16 SEER & higher	\$300
Water Source of Geothermal HP	\$400

Cedar-Knox PPD will document homeowner information and pay them an incentive either through a check or billing credit. We have brochures at our office and would be happy to give you one if you are interested.

2008 IRRIGATION LOAD CONTROL STATISTICS

- About 750 irrigation systems for 2008 season
- Controlled 14 days for 103 total hours (depending on the type of control you utilize, your total control hours will be different)
- Control Days by Month – July was 6 days for 42 ½ hours, while in August we controlled 8 days for 60 ½ hours
- This was the first year of Sunday control, we only controlled one Sunday (August 3rd) for 3 ½ hours
- We controlled until 11:00 p.m. one time, until 10:30 p.m. one time, and until 10:00 p.m. three times. The earlier release times are appreciated by all!!

If you are unable to pay your bill by the due date, be sure to call our office with payment arrangements. By doing so, you can avoid unnecessary collection attempts and associated charges. We are willing to work with you – just give us a call at 254-6291 or 800-891-5196.

Refrigerator/freezer recycling drive

Chances are, that old refrigerator or freezer in your garage or basement is running up your electric bill. That is because they can use three-times as much energy as the newer more efficient models.

If you want to get rid of that energy eater, you are in luck. Jaco Environmental Inc. is kicking off a recycling program in our area, which is sponsored by the Waste Reduction and Recycling Incentive Grant. You can contact them, by calling 1-866-444-9160 or visit their website at www.appliancerecycling.com. They will schedule a free pick up of your refrigerator or freezer, you will pick up \$35.00 and save money on your future electric bill. You will also have the satisfaction of knowing that you are helping the environment by recycling and disposing of that old appliance properly.

Incentive to "Change a Light"

Cedar-Knox Public Power will partner with Nebraska Public Power to offer you coupons for \$1 off single packs and \$3 off multi-packs of Compact Fluorescent Bulbs. These coupons will be available at participating retailers in your area starting October 1, 2008 and be available through December 31, 2008. Customers will be limited to five coupons per visit. Participating retailers will be listed on the NPPD website at www.nppd.com or look for the display at the store where you shop.

Reasons to "Change a Light"

- Use 70-75% less energy than their common light bulb equivalents.
- Last 10 times longer than an incandescent bulb.
- Can save an average of \$30 or more per bulb, over their lifetime.
- Help the environment by saving energy.
